Respondents Scotland (602)

- Accommodation and Food Services (20.8%), Other Service Activities (17.0%) and Wholesale/Retail/Motor trade (15.3%) were the most represented sectors.
- The largest group ran their business from home (34.2%).
- Those with 1-5 employees (44.0%) were most widely represented.
- Most respondents had been operating for over 20 years (30.9%) and were Limited Companies (53.8%)
- Over half (58.3%) were FSB members.

Aberdeen City & Shire (54)

- Manufacturing (24.1%), Wholesale/Retail/Motor trade (22.2%) and Other Service Activities (14.8%) were the most represented sectors.
- The largest group operated from an Industrial Park/Unit (35.2%).
- Those with 1-5 employees (46.3%) were most widely represented.
- Most respondents had been operating for over 20 years (44.4%) and were Limited Companies (61.1%)
- Over half (59.3%) were FSB members







- 98.1% of respondents identified as White: English/Welsh/Scottish/Northern Irish/British












